



Ordinance No. 17 20 21

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SAFETY-SERVICE TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT, UNDER THE HAMILTON COUNTY PURCHASING MASTER BID SERVICE PROGRAM, FOR THE PURCHASE OF A 2021 FORD F250 PICKUP TRUCK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Norwood participates in the Hamilton County Purchasing Master Bid Service Program, as authorized by Ordinance 4-2020, and Ohio Revised Code §9.48; and

**WHEREAS**, the Public Works Department needs to purchase a 2021 Ford Super Duty Pick-Up Truck, having determined that it is in the City’s best interest to purchase Ford vehicles, for the simplicity of Public Works maintenance and parts replacement; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Norwood has determined that the following base Ford vehicle is available for purchase at Beechmont Ford, having price matched the minimum bid in the Hamilton County Purchasing Master Bid Service Program: 2021 Ford F250 Super Duty Pick-Up Truck \$32,866.00, the lowest available bid made under the program pricing, and adding upgraded specifications needed for use in the Public Works Department totals \$36,555.00; now therefore,

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** The Safety-Service Director is authorized to enter into a contract with Beechmont Ford, having price matched the minimum bid in Hamilton County Purchasing Master Bid Service Program for the purchase of a 2021 Ford F250 Super Duty Pick-Up Truck and adding upgraded specifications needed for use in the Public Works Department for \$36,555.00.

**SECTION 2.** The City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw, and the City Treasurer is authorized to pay, warrants in the amounts and according to the terms described in Section 1; for the purchase of the 2021 F250 Super Duty Pick-up Truck with upgraded specifications needed for use in the Public Works Department, out of the **GENERAL FUND** 1001.

**SECTION 3.** The Safety-Service Director, or his designee, is hereby authorized to execute, on behalf of the City, any and all purchasing agreements, for the purchase, or other documents memorializing the City of Norwood's purchase of the aforementioned vehicle, as described above.


**SECTION 4.** This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, to avoid a likely price increase and if not purchased immediately, would incur a 6-8 month wait, due to unavailability of the base model through Ford dealers in the region.


