Ordinance No. 53 2021

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SAFETY-SERVICE DIRECTOR TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE REGENT AVENUE STREET REPAIR PROJECT, FROM WILLIAMS AVENUE TO THE SOUTH TERMINUS OF REGENT AVENUE, WITHIN THE CITY OF NORWOOD, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

**WHEREAS**, Council desires to help the City of Norwood benefit from outside funding to reconstruct the pavement on Regent Avenue, from Williams Avenue on the north, to the south terminus of Regent Avenue (just south of Lexington Avenue), including new curb and driveway aprons, the first \$1,600,000.00 of the project, which is the estimated full cost of the project, will be funded by an Ohio Public Works Commission Grant and Loan; and

**WHEREAS**, the plans and specifications will include an alternate bid item for replacing “private side” lead service lines between the curb box (at approximately the right-of-way) and the house, for each property along the project that draws from the Regent water line, which is not part of the OPWC funded project, but which will give each homeowner the option to replace their individual “private side” lead service line, at the homeowner’(s)’ expense, but which will use grant money through the EPA State Revolving Fund, at no cost to the City; now therefore,


**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the City of Norwood, State of Ohio, that:

**SECTION 1.** The Safety-Service Director is hereby authorized to advertise for bids, and enter into a contract with the lowest and best bidder, for the Regent Avenue Street Project, including its alternate bid items, pursuant to plans and specifications on file in the office of the Safety-Service Director.

**SECTION 2.** The City Auditor is hereby authorized to draw and the City Treasurer to pay warrants, if any, for the foregoing purpose out of FUND 02-0852-57600 STREET MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR FUND.


**SECTION 3.** This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency ordinance and a measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare and shall go into effect forthwith. The reason for said emergency is the necessity to implement a street improvement project that improves the health and safety of the City of Norwood, by benefitting from the OPWC grant and loan funding currently available.


